

## Honors College Curriculum Checklist

To graduate from the Honors College, students must have a 3.30 GPA at the time of graduation and complete the following courses with a minimum final grade of 'C' or better:

<b>Taken during years 1 and 2: <i>Civilizations: Past, Present, and Future I-IV</i> (also called the <i>Civilizations Sequence</i>- Classic or Flourish) (4 credits each)</b>		
	HON 111	only offered in the fall
	HON 112	only offered in the spring
	HON 211	only offered in the fall
	HON 212	only offered in the spring
<b>Two of the following three courses: taken during any year, any semester (1 credit each):</b>		
	HON 170	<i>Currents and Contexts</i>
	HON 175	<i>Community Building &amp; Engagement</i> --only available for incoming first-year students; course begins during bridge week in late August.
	HON 180	<i>A Cultural Odyssey</i>
<b>Typically taken during year 3:</b>		
	HON 3XX	<i>Honors Tutorial OR Tutorial Alternative (HON 349) (0-3 credits)</i>
	HON 391	<i>Introduction to Thesis Research</i> -- prerequisite to HON 498. <b>(1 credit)</b>
<b>Typically taken during year 4 (3 credits each):</b>		
	HON 498	<i>Honors Directed Study</i> (1 <sup>st</sup> of 2 courses)
	HON 499	<i>Honors Thesis</i> (2 <sup>nd</sup> of 2 courses)

### Additional Information

- **The Civilizations Sequence must be completed with a minimum GPA of 3.00 for the four courses. (i.e. a 'B' average)**
- The Civilizations Sequence satisfies the University's Human Values and Social Contexts (HVSC) general education requirement for 16 out of the 18 required credits.
  - Taking two of the following 3 classes, HON 170, HON 175, and HON 180, will provide the two additional required credits.
- Successful ("C" or better) completion of both HON 111 and HON 112 waives the college composition (ENG 101) requirement.
- HON 211 and HON 212 each satisfy the writing intensive (outside the major) requirement.
- Students who have completed HON 111, 112, 211, 212, and 2 of the 3 of HON 170, 175, and 180 **will still need to fulfill the mathematics, science, and capstone requirements.**
